

STUART L. DISSTON, AIA

Stuart Disston, AIA, joined Austin Patterson Disston Architects in 1984 and in 1994 was made a Partner. He has served as the Project Architect and Project Manager on numerous residential, commercial, interiors, and institutional projects throughout the tri-state area. Mr. Disston leads the firm's Quogue, New York office, established in 2000.

Mr. Disston has worked on residential projects that include many large estates in Connecticut, Long Island, and Westchester County. His designs for residences in Quogue, Lyme, New Canaan, Westport, and Rowayton have won the firm awards from American Institute of Architects Connecticut. In addition two of his Connecticut projects have won the Alice Washburn/AIA Award for new traditional houses in Connecticut. His watercolor of Il Duomo, Florence was the recipient of a recent AIA/CT Drawing Award.

Mr. Disston received his Bachelor of Architecture from Syracuse University's School of Architecture in 1982. He attended the Syracuse Program of Architecture in Florence and the Wave Hill Center for Environmental Studies in New York. He is certified to practice architecture in the State of Connecticut and New York.

In writing about one of Mr. Disston's award-winning projects, jury member Terence Riley, then Curator of Architecture at the Museum of Modern Art in New York commented: "At a moment when many architects are interested in history, this is a rare house to hit a note of authenticity and not simply stylistic revival. The architect knows the traditional language of architecture and deploys it quite well, and also knows when to slow down."

Mr. Disston currently serves on the Advisory Board of Syracuse University's School of Architecture.
